- the existing and future work of the Awareness Node and hotline:
 - a) **The YPRT toolkit contains a list of potentially effective technological measures that can be used in the future promotional and educational campaigns targeting parents and teachers (Chapter B)**
 - b) **High priority on improving the digital literacy of children and teenagers as well as parents and teachers through trainings, workshops, competitions (Chapter C 5 and 6)**

 - Safety events (such as Safer internet Day)
 - Awareness contests, workshops, roundtables for project target groups
